The Presentation night was enjoyed by celebrating the success for many members winning the Club Championships for 2022/2023. The winners are shown as follows:



A portion of our members do not participate in Pennant, or any events/competitions registered with Bowls Victoria. Introducing a new class of membership will provide greater choice for our members. The club will save in affiliation fees for members that only play in social games so we would be able to offer a discounted Social Bowlers (non-affiliated) membership to those members. 

ASK THE UMPIRE – APRIL 2023

The last match of the season was vital. A win would see Donvale 8 through to the section final. A loss would mean that the side's opponents would make it through instead.

Helpful Herbert's rink had been slow and by the time they started their last end all the other rinks had finished, with the club up on the main scoreboard by 5 shots. It goes without saying that Nasty Norm was Helpful Herbert's opponent.

With his last bowl Nasty Norm moved the jack near to the boundary line and as a result Nasty Norm was holding 6 shots. Helpful Herbert had one bowl left to save the game for the side. Drawing 5th shot would do it.

Instead of playing wide to bring his bowl into the jack, Helpful Herbert played across the rink and after moving the jack a little his bowl became a resting toucher.

Nasty Norm immediately claimed that Helpful Herbert's bowl was out of bounds on the basis it looked *"over the line"*, i.e., over an old line on the green that had once been a centre line. Helpful Herbert didn't agree. They both called *"umpire"* at the same time, upon which the club's oldest umpire hobbled up clutching the boundary scope. Nasty Norm considered this umpire an old fool and got a laugh from his mates when he asked the umpire whether he had a licence to operate *"that thing"*. The elderly umpire politely replied that he did.

After peering through the scope, the umpire declared Helpful Herbert's bowl to be *"out"*. This caused Nasty Norm to revise his opinion of this umpire and he said, *"thanks very much"*.

The umpire merely continued to peer through the scope and said *"the jack is out too. The jack is dead. The end's dead. Replay the end".* Nasty Norm immediately yelled *"we only asked you to check the bowl and not the jack as well".*

"You have heard my decision," said the elderly umpire. Nasty Norm reverted to his former opinion while Helpful Herbert said "thanks".

On the replayed end Nasty Norm scored 4 shots and Donvale 8 went into the section finals with a win by 1 shot. Phew!!!

But was the umpire, right?

Umpire Barry says he was.

<u>Law C27</u> defines the side boundaries of the rink of play as the imaginary straight line connecting the centres of the boundary pegs on opposite banks that show the limits of the rink of play.

<u>Law 17.1.6</u> says a bowl is dead if in its original course it comes to rest outside a side boundary even though it may have come to rest in contact with the outside edge of the jack.

Law 19.1.1 says that if a jack is moved by a bowl in play, it is dead if it passes completely outside a side boundary.

Law 40.1.4 says that if a decision reached by the skips is not in line with the Laws of the Sport of Bowls, the umpire must overrule that decision so that it is in line with the Laws.

<u>Law 43.2.5</u> says that it is among the umpire's duties to decide whether a jack or a bowl is in play or not.

<u>Moral 1</u> When you call an umpire the umpire must look at every aspect of a situation and apply the Law.

Moral 2 Old chalk lines do not constitute the rink boundaries.




TERESA BOWDEN - OUR CLUB MEMBER

One such character at Donvale is Helen Milner A brief insight into Helen's working life, her involvement at Donvale Bowls Club, and the successful experiences it provided.

With her twin sister Ruth, she attended East Kew Primary School, then on to East Camberwell Girls School, (later known as Canterbury Girls Secondary School).

Finally graduating with Dip. Physiotherapy in 1965, commencing work at Royal Children's Hospital in February 1966.

In 1967 she transferred to Yooralla Carlton as Senior Physiotherapist.

During this period, she worked at Yea and Alexandra Hospitals (thanks to her father who believed that you always put more into the community than you took out).

At the same time her parents had bought a farm at Strath Creek and the local GP mentioned they needed a Physio. Perfect timing for Helen.

She discovered life on a farm involves hard work and long hours, at the end of her Physic shift she would help her parents building the cattle yards, general farm duties, including the odd mishaps while drenching sheep.

In 1968 she travelled to Canada, working in Galt Ontario for 2 years, once again during shifts enjoying great skiing opportunities.

In 1970 she returned to Melbourne for Christmas, working for Scope (formerly known as Spastic Society of Victoria). During this period, she raised three children, Bronwyn, Tamara, and 7oe

Locums for Yooralla Balwyn, and Scope.

Conducted a private practice (part time) 1976-2000) Health Department (part time) 1976 -2014 same role, many changes arose, dependent on which political party was in power.

A good deal of her work with the Health Department consisting mainly with premature babies and infants with movement difficulties.

1993 returning to full time work.

Outside of her successful and demanding professional life she found time to follow her father's advice ("giving to the community more than you take out").
