### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Hello Members

It is an exciting time for our club as we eagerly anticipate the bequest from the estate of Bruce Hallman. Expected in May, this substantial endowment heralds a rare opportunity to pursue a significant upgrade of our facilities. Among the proposed enhancements lies the possibility of a covered front green. A dome promises to unlock the full potential of our beloved sport for the Manningham community, and ensure sustained growth in our sports diverse social and health benefits for current and future generations. It would place our club and bowls on the map in the North/Eastern suburbs. Should the vision of a covered green not materialize, fear not, for we are poised to recommence the project to install a state-of-the-art synthetic surface with lights, directly in front of our

clubhouse and Alfresco area.

As we navigate this exciting chapter in our club's evolution, it's imperative to cast our gaze towards other integral facets of our organization, notably our constitution, uniform, and logo.

Our current constitution is not compliant with the Model Rules of the Associations Incorporation Reform Regulations 2023. With the help of Grant Purdy and Frank Smit, a new constitution is being prepared for our club. Initially they attempted to align our existing constitution to the Model Rules. It was then agreed that a better approach was to start with the Model Rules and modify those to suit the specifics of our bowling club. They are making good progress, and a draft should be available for member scrutiny and then a vote over the next few months. Our heartfelt gratitude extends to Grant and Frank for their dedication with this task.

The discussion surrounding the rejuvenation of our club's uniform is gaining momentum. Like many other members, I believe that our uniform needs to be refreshed, in terms of a modern look and better material. However, let us tread this path with care, mindful that preferences in design and colours for uniforms are very subjective, and often elicits strong views for and against change. It is also something that should not be looked at in isolation. A change in design and colour must be considered in conjunction with our identity, heritage, values, location, local culture, and trends in our sport. The new uniform needs to align with any new logo design, and what our envisioned club branding represents. A small group is coming together to kick off this project. Please contact me if any member has a strong interest and/or relevant experience to help with this creative process. Of course, members opinions and feedback will be crucial in determining the direction we go, and what the process and cost would be to roll out the new uniform. Once again, it is a good time for our club to consider this change.

In tandem with these endeavors, our club's continued growth and success hinge upon the strength and diversity of our Management Committee. While our current team deserves commendation for their stellar stewardship, the call for fresh perspectives and extra support resounds louder than ever. There are opportunities for members to contribute their expertise and enthusiasm in several roles, including membership, vice-chairman, media (newsletters/newsflashes/Facebook), assistant-treasury, assistant-secretarial and general committee. I implore each of you to consider nominating for a role, which can be tailored to your skills, interests, and availability, prior to the next AGM in June.

One of our members said to me recently they enjoy our winter bowls program more than the Summer program. I can understand that sentiment (even though I normally head North for a few months during the chill of Melbourne's Winter). Our winter program provides warmth and camaraderie with a variety of organised bowling opportunities on five days of the week. Many members enjoy the more relaxed and social aspects of winter, compared to the slightly more intense summer program of Pennant, training, club championships and competitions. We are blessed to have such a dedicated and talented group of volunteers who provide such extensive programs, for Summer, and Winter.

In our last Management Committee meeting we enthusiastically endorsed the appointment of Barry Ferguson, as our Head Coach for the coming season. On behalf of all members of Donvale, I want to express our excitement in welcoming Barry back. His return and appointment as Head Coach brings a renewed sense of enthusiasm and optimism for the upcoming season. Barry's experience and passion for the sport are evident, and we are confident that under his guidance, our players will continue to grow and excel. We appreciate the effort Barry has already put in, including crafting a comprehensive coaching and training program, reviewing our last season team performances, organizing pre-season open training sessions, and contributing to our monthly newsletter. And, as a bonus, we also welcome Sue Ferguson back.

Recently, it seems that I have been lodging a steady stream of complaints and suggestions to the Manningham Council. I do thank the council in most cases for their fast and efficient responses. They have recently repainted most of the car park lines including new directional arrows, sprayed the Blackberries in the bush adjacent to our greens, pruned the trees on East side of synthetic green, and a contractor has commenced installing a new keypad to make it easier for our members to unlock the gate. They will also arrange to fix the tripping hazard in the path leading up to the gate. In the meantime, Gary Brady has sprayed the uneven pavement as a warning. Please watch your step when walking up to the gate.

On Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> April Donvale played at Templestowe in the annual Manningham Mayoral Challenge, involving the four Clubs in Manningham, Greythorn, Doncaster, Donvale, and Templestowe. Each club enters two teams comprised of two male and two female current committee members. Our teams did well, being the only club to win three out of four games, but Templestowe won the event based on overall shots-up. This is an important event for Manningham bowls clubs as it promotes bowls and the friendliness of our Clubs to the council. It is also a great opportunity to talk to committee members from other clubs. The Manningham council hold the event in high regard, and it was attended by two current councillors as well as the Mayor.

The club is indebted to Jan Meehan and Leanne Sullivan for their significant contribution in producing our newsletters. Our club newsletters, over an extended period, have been of a very high standard and frequency, which is challenging to maintain. Even more so with the recent passing of Ewan Simpson. We sincerely thank Jan and Leanne for their hard work and creativity to continue the high standard.

## Mal's Major Projects Report

#### Front green

The council has updated us on the progress of possible amendments to the Sports Infrastructure & Allocation Policy. We need that policy changed to allow for council funding of a canopy for bowling clubs. Then we need the council to approve a change in the current budget for our synthetic green project, to be expanded to include a canopy. So still a way to go, as follows:

- The councilors and Officers have already had a briefing meeting to discuss the policy.
- The officers are now preparing a draft policy for the councilors to endorse in their next briefing meeting to be held on 7<sup>th</sup>May.
- A draft policy will be made public for community consultation from 31<sup>st</sup>May until the 29<sup>th</sup>June. It will be important or our club and the community to give support for the policy to cater for canopies at bowling clubs.
- After community consultation the council will review the policy again prior to final approval at a monthly council meeting. So, if the first draft policy does not allow for canopies, there is still a chance (probably small) that canopies may be allowed for in the final draft.
- If the policy is amended to include canopies, we will make a submission to the council to increase the scope and budget of our current synthetic green project, to include a canopy.
- If the budget for a canopy is approved, the design and tender documents will need to be amended.
- At any stage, if the club agrees that the policy amendment and/or revised budget allocation is not approved, or is not likely to be approved, within an acceptable timeframe, we will immediately restart the synthetic green project (which is currently on hold and ready to issue for tenders).

The council has provided an estimate for the cost of the green replacement and lighting, which is much higher than we expected. We have therefore requested the council to consider changes to the specifications to reduce the overall cost. One area is the civil works which provide for extensive drainage works which are more than synthetic green contractors say is necessary. The other area is the electric power for the lighting, which we believe can be routed more efficiently to our existing switchboard. We intend to install LED lighting on the back and front greens, which will reduce the power requirements to below what we currently use on the back green only.

If we proceed with a canopy the drainage works for the front green will be much less extensive. Lighting will also be provided within the canopy, so lighting towers will not be required.

#### **Back Green Toilet**

My next project to start planning is a toilet for the back green.

# Ask the Umpire

Nasty Norm picked up the jack which his lead had rolled and centred it. The jack was about 300mm

beyond the 21 metre mark on the bank.

Nasty Norm then called out to his lead "where's the mat?" "On the T" was the reply.

Having heard this conversation Helpful Herbert was happy with the position of the jack and the end proceeded.

When Helpful Herbert and Nasty Norm walked to the mat end to deliver their bowls. Helpful Herbert didn't like what he saw. He was 5 down at the head and discovered that the mat's rear end was on the T, not the front end, which meant that the mat line was 600mm up the green. The jack was short!

Helpful Herbert immediately told Nasty Norm in no uncertain terms that the jack was short and the end was therefore dead. Nasty Norm replied to the effect that this was rubbish and that it was too late to complain about a short jack.

Helpful Herbert yelled "umpire" whereupon the club's newest umpire ran up. She had made a study of the Laws and Domestic Regulations and without hesitation told Helpful Herbert that Nasty Norm was right.

Was the umpire right? Umpire Barry says she was. Law 9.7 says that after the first bowl has been delivered no one has the right to challenge the legality of the original position of the jack.

#### Note:

- The jack is improperly delivered if it comes to rest less than 21 metres from the mat line, ie. the front edge of the mat (Law 10.1.3 as modified by Domestic Regulation 1.3)
- The mark on the bank is 21 metres from the 2 metre mark. Therefore for the jack to be the required distance of 21 metres, the mat line must be on the 2 metre mark.
- If the mat is one mat length up the green, the mat line is therefore 600mm up the green. The rolled jack must therefore be at least 600mm past the 21 metre mark in these circumstances.
- The further up the green you take the mat, the rolled jack must be at least the same distance past the 21 metre mark.
- If, in a game, you feel the jack is short, ask the umpire to measure it.
- The whole of the jack as measured must be at least 21 metres from the mat line. A fraction less than 21 metres means a short jack.

#### Why ASK THE UMPIRE when you can BE AN UMPIRE?

The club is always on the lookout for new umpires so why not give it a go? If you are interested, please speak to Ken Eldridge. The training and exams are not onerous, you will learn new skills and help your club. All the club's present umpires will have no hesitation in helping you both before and after you qualify.
