ASK THE UMPIRE – OCTOBER 2023

VISIT TO THE ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS 12th October 2023

The 24 of us who braved the rain, with our umbrellas held high, thoroughly enjoyed the day. We learnt from our guides the valuable foresight of our brilliant botanists' who established these gardens.

Von Mueller in 1846 established a vast array of plants on 38 hectares. Later, Guilfoyle rearranged the plants to provide an artistic landscape. We would walk around curves in the path and "hey presto", a new vista of plants appeared, what a tranquil oasis for us all to enjoy.

In Japan they have the words for the experience, "Shinrinyoku", which can be defined as making contact with, and taking in the atmosphere of the forest. Their authorities say, "go into the forest regularly, it is good for your mental health".

As we walked around, we began appreciating the diversity of plants that have evolved over some 470 million years. There are about 380,000 species of plants to see. Guilfoyle's Volcano was something to enjoy and behold.

We finished our day in bright sunshine, feasting on food at the Terrace Café overlooking the ornamental lake.

GREENS REPORT



UPDATE ON GRASS GREEN REPLACEMENT

I met with the council and some consultants assisting the council on the 19th October, to ensure the works quoted covers everything we require. Things discussed were the sprinkler system, ditch wall requirements, soil disposal, lighting locations and several other things.

I will be placing some samples, in the clubhouse, of the synthetic surfaces from each contractor that we have approved for the council to consider. These are the only contractors and surfaces the council are considering, on our advice, and also approved by Bowls Vic.

Please when you are bowling at other clubs if you play on one of these surfaces, I would love your feedback. The samples will be in the clubhouse before the end of October. I am waiting for one more sample to arrive.

Major projects

I have presented a list of projects to INC for them to consider. The purpose is for INC to decide which projects to prioritise and desired timing. If you have any project ideas, please talk to me and I will add them to the project list for consideration. This is being done at this time to be ready if the promised bequest money does eventuate. The only current major project is the upgrade of the grass green.

PENNANT TICK SYSTEM REMINDER

Skips and thirds are asked to be accurate in recording of ticks, not to be generous for any reason.

Short Bowls will not be recorded.

Type of shot - Tick requirement

- Draw within one mat length of jack.
- **Position shot** within one mat length of target position selected by the skip.
- **Trailing the jack** moving the jack the required distance.
- Weighted shot or drive hitting the target [not almost hitting it] this may be a jack, bowl, or a number of bowls.

- Other shots As directed by the skips [tick to be given if shot is judged successful.]
- Lucky wick If you put down a really bad bowl and get a "luck wick" to get a resting toucher, it was still a really bad bowl - no tick.

Important

- Effective communication by the skip to a bowler on the mat is critical.
- If no direction is given by the skip to a bowler on the mat, then it should be assumed by that bowler that a draw shot is required.

Let's collectively extend a warm and hearty welcome to all our new members. A simple smile and a helping hand can go a long way in making them feel at home.



Donvale Bowls Club is indeed indebted and beholden to many of our beloved characters which define and distinguish it. One such character at Donvale is John Cobain A brief insight into John's working life, his eventual involvement at Donvale Bowls Club, and the experiences it has provided.

He was born in Richmond in 1943 living with his parents and older brother in East Kew. He attended the East Kew Primary school, and on to Balwyn High, the year after it opened.

John worked from an early age delivering a local newspaper once a week, in his mid-teens he worked in a hardware shop after school, mornings Monday's through to Saturday.

After completing year 11 at school, he had a number of odd jobs gaining his first regular employment with SSW Food Wholesalers at their head office in Nth. Fitzroy. Working there for 15 years. Following on, he worked with his brother in his accounting practice for a couple of years, assisting clients maintaining their books and general auditing work.

He was then employed at the Veneto Club in Bulleen as office manager and accountant from 1980 through to his retirement in December 2013 at the age of 70.

Continued working one day a week at the club on a voluntary basis for the following six years.

He met his future wife Cathie in 1964 at a dance called 431 in St Kilda Road and they married in February 1968. Following a honeymoon, they moved into their brand-new home in Dellfield Drive Templestowe.

They had two boys, Tim, and Simon, both now living in Townsville and Cairns respectively with their families. Unfortunately, Cathie was diagnosed with Liver Cancer late November 2011, moving to her lungs, despite never smoking.

She fought it with chemo every Thursday at Epworth Hospital in Box Hill for over two years. She sadly passed away in July 2014. Cathie was a member of woman's interest group (WIGS).

Norma Juchno also a member, organized a twilight bowling night at Donvale Bowls Club. Cathie enjoyed the night so much, she encouraged John to join the bowls club when we retired, unfortunately she passed away only a few months later.

John decided to join Donvale Bowls Club in mid- 2015. How fortunate the club has been he made that decision.

Always prepared and ready to give of his time when called upon, a hand- up if there are duties or tasks needed to be addressed.

His ongoing contribution and company at Donvale is valued and appreciated.
